# UAS SEARCH EXERCISE

Our UAS Unit was contacted in early July to help with a search for a model aircraft that was lost near the Peoria Flat R/C Field. We thought it would be a great training exercise for a Search and Rescue operation, so Doug Simmons, Randie Revilla, and Michelle Wagner responded to the call.

Because of the proximity to Columbia Airport, we notified the airport and got the okay to fly our mission and filed a Notice to

Airmen, as required. We made two flights of approximately 25 minutes each to search the surrounding areas. ## FROM THE COUNTY SUPERVISOR'S DESK

Greetings and happy August. We have had a number of close calls over the past month related to lightening strikes and human activity, but fortunately our hard-working fire fighters have thus far managed to control the spread of spot fires. This highlights the need for greater preparation and fire fuels reduction in our community, which is exactly what the Tuolumne County Fire Safety Advisory Committee is all about.

We have been hard at work on a number of important issues that we hope will advance the cause of fire preparedness in our community.

**Alert FM:**

We are looking at the possibility of contracting with a company called Alert FM, which builds and maintains a proprietary RF band emergency notification system. The cost of the system is high (nearly \$1 million) but it does not rely on existing cell tower or

electrical grid infrastructure to operate. Homeowners would need to purchase their own receiver, which can cost from \$60 to \$350. The receiver would display basic fire and evacuation information, will set off a loud alarm and will continue to operate even during a PSPS event. Please find more information here: <https://www.alertfm.com/>. I would very much appreciate your feedback on whether or not this is good backup notification system.

### Evacuation planning:

Tuolumne County GIS has developed an extremely useful tool for evacuation planning that you can view here: <https://www.tuolumnecounty.ca.gov/1163/Create-Your-Plan>. This site will allow you to develop an evacuation plan based on your home's location, and print out hard-copy maps of your surrounding area.

### Vegetation ordinance:

The Citizen Fire Advisory group is in the process of developing a countywide vegetation ordinance that will encourage fire fuels management on private property beyond the state Public Resources Code. We are actively seeking public input on this ordinance, as the only way to increase vegetation management and fire risk reduction is to get public buy-in. Many other rural counties have passed similar ordinances, and recent rulings from the state Board of Forestry will likely make such ordinances mandatory.


